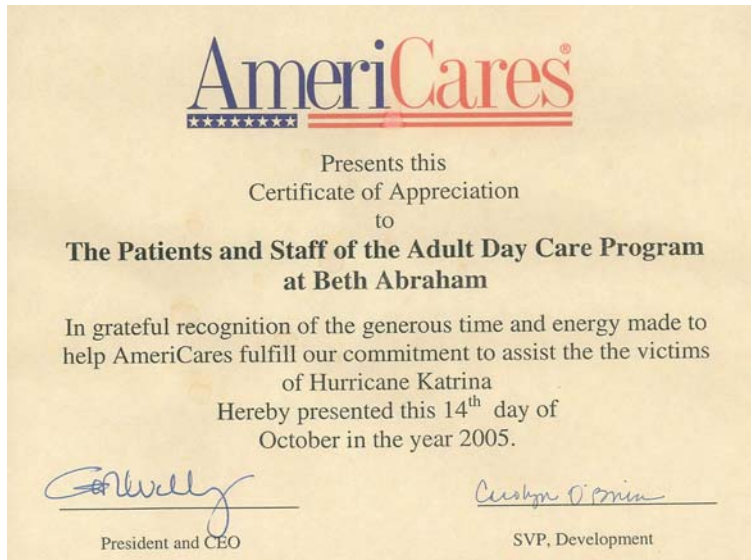




ADHC "CARES"
